Dr. Brown's practice includes chiropractic, acupuncture, percutaneous therapy (dry needling), Graston technique, and extracorporeal shockwave therapy (ESWT). He has Advanced Certification in Whiplash & Spinal Trauma from the San Diego Spine Research Institute. His practice includes licensed massage therapists who provide myofascial release therapy, cupping, and gua sha/scraping.

Dr. Brown is a Faculty Associate at Arizona State University, currently teaching the senior internship for pre-medical students. His research interests include

the safety of cervical spine manipulation and he performs peer review for the academic research journals Cureus and Stroke.

Dr. Brown serves as a chiropractic expert witness for the plaintiff or defense in medical malpractice cases. He also performs independent medical examinations and medical file review.
